#### A Lifesaving Delivery

The saturd amazing group of folks who bring food and social interaction to seniors and other homebound neighbors. I've also learned that some clients simply want daily fresh food delivered by a smiling face.

One particular story that reminds me of how important our service is involved a client who had fallen down the stairs in his house. When I arrived with the food. there was no answer to my knocks, to the doorbell or to my phone call. After a few minutes, I prepared to leave, but on a whim, I opened the door a crack and shouted inside. At that point, I heard a very faint call for help — too faint to be heard through the closed front door. I pushed in and found the client at the bottom of his stairs, where he had fallen out of his wheelchair. After making sure he was in no further danger, I called 911. They arrived within minutes.

I heard later that my senior was hospitalized for a while, but he was in no long-term danger. I'm not sure what would have happened if I had not opened that door a crack. One of his children later contacted me to say thanks.



# **Fast Facts**



Meals on Wheels can serve a senior for an entire year for about the same cost as just one day in a hospital or 10 days in a nursing home.

Daily home-delivered meals help keep 8 out of 10recipients who have previously fallen from falling again.





58% of home-delivered meal recipients live alone. For many of them, the person delivering the meal is often the only person they will see that day.

### **Keeping Seniors Safer**

This past year, we worked with the Cook County Sheriff's Department and Mobile Care to provide COVID-19 vaccines to seniors. Between March 31 and December 31, 2021, we coordinated:

> 1 walk-in vaccine clinic (Phoenix, III.): 150 vaccinations
